DRESSLER: How are you? 6 7 #655 is the diesel pump. We have areas that flood from time to 8 9 time, and the pump that we have is a much smaller 10 pump, it's approximately half the size, it's 11 four-inch. We're getting a larger pump to give us the capacity to empty out flooded areas more rapidly. 12 13 CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Right. Thank you. 14 MR. DRESSLER: Snap-On tools, #656, 15 it's tools that we use constantly throughout the year, so we do a blanket coverage, and we go into 16 17 that account so there's not a delay in slowing our 18 guys down from working. 19 And #657 is very important to us. 20 have areas that the Mosquito Division cannot get 21 into, boots on the ground. So, for those areas, we contract with a helicopter service. We basically fly 22

out of the Meadowlands area, and then they fly over

control the mosquito population, if we didn't do it

by air.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: So are these areas that are basically the same every year or you get reports of different areas and you add them?

MR. DRESSLER: They're basically the same. If we do get other reports, we will respond, but they're typically down around the marshlands, around Teterboro and the Meadowlands. It's just physically impossible to get to other than air.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Okay. And then you have one, #658, which is basically vegetation. I don't think it needs an explanation, but if you want to say anything about it.

MR. DRESSLER: The roadside vegetation plan was developed quite a few years ago. If you're familiar with the metal barricades on the county roads, the rails, we used to go and the guys would get out of the trucks and weed whack those areas, and obviously it's man intense for work hours. So what we do now is we drive by with a chemical truck and we spray the weeds, and it saves time and money overall.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: It's actually being done around at night. If you drive around at night right now, we're doing it starting sometime around 8:00, 9:00 at the night. Through the
