because it's been an effort to actually bring the
digital environment to the resolutions and
information, and tying that in with the technology
advancements that the Freeholders have done overall
with the streaming and everything else. So it's kind
of coalesced into a very cutting edge, brought us
into the 2lst century with regard to transparency,
and that's been a group effort, so it's good to hear
from the public that the public appreciates that
effort as well.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: We will now review the resolutions to be voted on tonight.

MS. BIANCHI: Resolutions \#643-18
through \#667-18.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Okay. Anyone have anything on Page 2, any questions?
(No response.)

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: Chairman, \#643 and
\#644 are both grants, I'm wondering if we could do
them as Body of the Whole?

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Any objection?

VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ORTIZ: No.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Seeing none, those will be done as the Body of the Whole.

Page 3.

EREEHOLDER TANELLI: Chairman?

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Sir.

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: I'd like to sponsor \#646 and \#647, please.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: You're a terrible golfer, though.

VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ORTIZ: I'll sponsor

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: Okay. You guys

and \#654, can we do them, they're all shared
services, as a Body of the Whole, please?

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Is there any

FREEHOLDER VOSS: No.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: We'll move those
into Body of the Whole.

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: Thank you, sir.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Page 5 。

I'd like to sponsor \#655, \#656, and
\# 657 .

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: I'll co-sponsor.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Ray, do you want to
give a little outline on these?

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: I'll co-sponsor
those.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Thank you,

Freeholder Steve.

MR. DRESSLER: Good evening.

FREEHOLDER GANZ: Good evening.

MR. DRESSLER: How are you?
\#655 is the diesel pump.

We have areas that flood from time to time, and the pump that we have is a much smaller pump, it's approximately half the size, it's four-inch. We're getting a larger pump to give us the capacity to empty out flooded areas more rapidly. CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Right. Thank you.

MR. DRESSLER: Snap-On tools, \#656, it's tools that we use constantly throughout the year, so we do a blanket coverage, and we go into that account so there's not a delay in slowing our guys down from working.

And \#657 is very important to us. We have areas that the Mosquito Division cannot get into, boots on the ground. So, for those areas, we contract with a helicopter service. We basically fly out of the Meadowlands area, and then they fly over areas that are confined that we'd never get to to control the mosquito population, if we didn't do it
by air.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: So are these areas that are basically the same every year or you get reports of different areas and you add them?

MR. DRESSLER: They're basically the same. If we do get other reports, we will respond, but they're typically down around the marshlands, around Teterboro and the Meadowlands. It's just physically impossible to get to other than air.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Okay. And then you have one, \#658, which is basically vegetation. I don't think it needs an explanation, but if you want to say anything about it.

MR. DRESSLER: The roadside vegetation plan was developed quite a few years ago. If you're familiar with the metal barricades on the county roads, the rails, we used to go and the guys would get out of the trucks and weed whack those areas, and obviously it's man intense for work hours. So what we do now is we drive by with a chemical truck and we spray the weeds, and it saves time and money overall.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: It's
actually being done around at night. If you drive around at night right now, we're doing it starting sometime around 8:00, 9:00 at the night. Through the
entire night, they're spraying.

MR. DRESSLER: When the traffic is
lower, of course.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: We're on Page 6.

FREEHOLDER TANELLI: Chairman, \#659
would be a shared service, Body of the Whole?

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Sure.

Any objections to \#659 being the Body of the Whole?

I want to just talk about this \#659, please. Is there someone here from Public Safety?

Do you want to just talk about this \#659, please.

MS. D'ALOIA: Christina D'Aloia, Consumer Affairs.
\#659: We have had a Shared Services Agreement with the Board of Social Services for a couple of years now. This is just a renewal. We provide an investigator to aid them in just investigating Social Security fraud or SNAP fraud, welfare fraud. Basically, our investigator goes in and finds individuals who have been collecting money on people who have already been deceased or left the country or things like that. That's his main job.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Thank you.

MS. D'ALOIA: You're welcome.

FREEHOLDER GANZ: If I may, Chairman, what is the average recovery?

MS. D'ALOIA: From the Board of Social

Services, I'm not aware. They haven't told me. I can get that information for you.

MR. TENHOEVE: It's usually anywhere from two to $\$ 10,000$ per meeting that we get a report that we've been able to recover.

CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: Thank you.
