So, there were a number of trusts that were setup a number of years ago, 20, 25 years ago, and we technically never had that final state approval, so this is more of kind of a housekeeping exercise in making sure that we have everything, all our i's are dotted, our t's are crossed on there, and Melissa did a great job of going through them. She contacted each of the departments and made sure the validity of these trusts, and some of these trusts, if we don't get approval, they're going to be closed

    and the proceeds will be go into revenue, go into
2
    unanticipated revenue, because it's important that,
    again, the way to spend money in New Jersey, you have
4
    to do it through a budget appropriation through the
5
    Freeholders or you have to do it through a dedication
    by rider -- right, I know Germaine is taking the

    classes, the CFO classes -- or you spend money

    through capital through an ordinance.

25
    took in for the easement went into a trust for Ramapo
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1 Park, to do improvements to the Ramapo Park. 2 MR. LUPPINO: That's in Mahwah. 3 MS. HOWARD: Yes, the Mahwah portion of 4 the park. So that's what that money is sitting in 5 there now, if we have to do any improvements in that park, the money in the trust fund can be used to make 6 improvements to that park. 8 FREEHOLDER AMOROSO: Does anyone know 9 that money is there? 10 MR. LUPPINO: Yes, Adam Strobel is 11 working on that. So Planning is very aware of that. They basically said, "Don't touch that money. 12 need it." 13 14 FREEHOLDER AMOROSO: And you answered 15 David about how much is in that. 16 MS. HOWARD: I don't want to be quoted, I think it's about \$700,000, I think is the original 17 18 money that was in there. 19 FREEHOLDER AMOROSO: That's a lot of bucks! 20 21 MS. HOWARD: Yes. 22 From the beginning, when we first took 23 it in, that's still in that account right now, so none of it's been touched. 24

FREEHOLDER AMOROSO: Wow!

1 Thank you. MR. LUPPINO: I was just reminded from Jim Koth, because Jim Koth, our Parks Director, is 4 involved with this, and it's for the acquisition of 5 the right-of-way for that property up in Mahwah, Jim? MR. KOTH: Yes. 8 MR. LUPPINO: Yes. 9 Why don't you come up, Jim, because I 10 know Jim's been working on it. 11 MR. KOTH: When Tennessee Gas came through and needed a right-of-way through Ramapo 12 13 Reservation, that was a diversion of parklands, so 14 state Green Acres rules require that they have a 15 replacement for that at $1 \ 1/2$ times what was lost, so 16 that's what the money is for and we're currently 17 looking for suitable properties that match Green 18 Acres' requirements to spend that money. So we're 19 basically getting 150 percent of what we lost with 20 the right-of-way. 21 CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN: There's a question 22 from Freeholder Ganz. 23 FREEHOLDER GANZ: If I may?
