Linter, Director of the Department of Human Services, that the County of Bergen is hereby authorized to exercise the first option and renew the Affiliation Agreement with Eastwick College, 10 South Franklin Tumpike, Ramsey, NJ 07446, for the period April 27, 2016 to April 26, 2017, for the provision of Level I fieldwork experiences for students in the Eastwick College Occupational Therapy program, as per the attached Affiliation Agreement; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or County Administrator be and is hereby authorized to execute said Affiliation Agreement, in a form to be approved by County Counsel.

# AFFILIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN BERGEN COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND EASTWICK COLLEGE

This agreement is effective the 27th day of April 2016 and is by and between Eastwick College, having its principal business address at 10 South Franklin Turnpike, Ramsey, New Jersey (hereinafter "the College") and Bergen County Department of Human Services as agent for facilities on attached Schedule A (hereinafter individually and collectively referred to as "the Facility"),

WHEREAS, Eastwick College has an education program for students in Occupational Therapy (hereinafter "the Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Facility has the resources to provide clinical training to students in basic occupational therapy procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Facility and the College desire to affiliate for the purpose of providing a clinical training program (hereinafter the "Clinical Training Program") at the Facility for students in the College's Program; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 556-15, dated June 3, 2015, authorized the County of Bergen to enter into an Affiliation Agreement with Eastwick College for the period April 27, 2015 to April 26, 2016, with four (4), twelve (12) - month renewal options, for the provision of Level I fieldwork experiences for students in the Eastwick College Occupational Therapy program, and which the County shall be paid a quarterly clinical site fee in the amount of \$1,875.00; and

WHEREAS, the County now desires to exercise the first option to renew the Affiliation Agreement with Eastwick College for the period April 27, 2016 to April 26, 2017. NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

### A. Responsibilities of the College:

1. Assume and maintain full responsibility for the planning and execution of the

- educational program in occupational therapy, including programming, administration, curriculum content, faculty appointments, faculty administration, and the requirements for promotion and graduation of sudents.
- The College shall designate a faculty member who shall serve as the
  "Academic Fieldwork Coordinator," to coordinate the Clinical Training
  Program with the Facility. Both parties shall mutually agree upon the Clinical
  Training Program.
- The College shall coordinate with the Facility to establish a schedule of student assignments, and the number of students eligible to participate in the Clinical Training Program. Both parties shall agree on the dates, hours, and duration of the assignment.
- The Academic Fieldwork Coordinator shall assign to the Facility only those students who have satisfactorily completed the prerequisite didactic portion of the curriculum.
- 5. The College shall coordinate with the Facility the performance of an annual joint evaluation to determine if the participation of the occupational therapy students meets the standards of patient care of the Facility, as well as the educational objectives of the College.
- The College and its students are responsible for complying with all pertinent rules and regulations, policies and procedures established by the Facility, as they may be amended from time to time.
- 7. The College and its students are required to maintain patient confidentiality as required by all federal, state and other applicable laws and regulations, including but not limited to: the Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records, 42 C.F.R. Section 2; the New Jersey AIDS Reporting and Confidentiality Law, N.J.S.A. 26-SC-5 et seq.; New Jersey Public Health Law; and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996

- ("HIPAA") and the HIPAA Privacy Standards.
- 8. The College and its students are required to maintain such records as may be required by the Facility to comply with federal and state law and regulations, and with required third-party payers and regulatory authorities, including, but not limited to Medicare, Medicaid, the Comptroller General of the United States and the Department of Health and Human Services. The responsibilities to prepare and maintain such records and reports will survive termination of this Agreement, and all patients' records, claims and correspondence belong to the Facility and must be maintained and retained on the Pacility's premises. The College and its students shall also be required to maintain and retain all records and reports pertinent to the students' clinical experience. These records shall be made available to the Facility upon request.
- The College on behalf of each assigned student shall provide the Facility with the following:
  - A. Evidence determined by a physical examination that each student is in good general health and free from a health impairment that is of potential risk to a patient or which might interfere with the performance of his or her duties. The evidence also includes passing a drug test, and being free from any other condition that would interfere with the student's ability to satisfy the requirements of this Agreement and/or potentially create risks to his or her own health, and the health and safety of the Facility, its patients, staff, visitors, and other affiliates.
  - B. Evidence that each student has received: (1) vaccination for rubella consistent with good medical practice, or a rubella screening blood test with documentation of its results, including scrologic evidence of immunity (all scronegative female students of child-bearing age shall provide documentation that they were informed regarding the potential adverse effects of rubella during pregnancy); (2) vaccination for measles (rubecla) or evidence of immunity to measles for those students born in 1957 or later, and (3) PPD (Mantoux) skin test for tuberculosis prior to participation in the Clinical Training Program and no less than every year thereafter for students with negative chest x-rays. All students who are scronegative and unvaccinated shall be clinically restricted in the event of a rubella or rubeola outbreak in the Facility.
  - C. The Academic Fieldwork Coordinator shall-maintain a current list of

- all students who are seronegative and unvaccinated and provide such list to the Pacility upon request.
- D. Prior to commencement of any assignment in the Clinical Training Program, the Facility shall receive evidence that the student has received the vaccination against hepatitis B, proof of immunity to hepatitis B, or a signed declination form indicating that the student has declined to be vaccinated against hepatitis B.
- B. Criminal Background checks are completed by the College and can be supplied to the clinical site as requested.
- 10. The College shall obtain and maintain at its own expense during the term of this Agreement, and any renewal hereof, a comprehensive liability policy including general and professional liability. The policy must insure the College against any and all claims for personal and bodily injury or death and property damage resulting from the performance of services by the College, its employees, staff and agents, and all students participating in the Clinical Training Program and/or the presence of students or other College personnel on the Facility's premises. Such insurance shall be in the amount of no less than \$1,000,000 per incident and an annual aggregate of \$3,000,000. Such insurance is to be written by a carrier licensed in New Jersey and rated at least an "A" by A.M. Best Company. The College is also responsible for any deductible or retention under these policies. The College, upon execution of this Agreement and anytime upon request, shall furnish the Facility with evidence that it has complied with the above requirements for liability coverage. The Facility shall be listed as an additional insured on all liability insurance policies of the College,
- 11. The College agrees to defend, indemnify and to hold harmless the Facility, its officers, directors, trustees, agents, employees, assignees, affiliates, representatives, joint-ventures, successor corporation(s) and health care personnel, directly or indirectly involved in any way in the Clinical Training

Program from any and all liabilities, claims, actions, suits, settlements, judgments, costs, damages and liabilities including medical claims or expenses and attorney's fees, resulting from, arising out of or which might arise or otherwise be asserted or connected with the operation or conduct of the Clinical Training Program including, but not limited to negligence involving the death or injury of a patient. The College also agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the Facility harmless for its failure to comply with any of the obligations or representations in the Agreement, including but not limited to a failure to maintain insurance as required in the Agreement.

## B. Responsibilities of the Facility

- The Facility will provide orientation for the faculty and students.
- For Level I fieldwork experiences, The Facility shall provide qualified supervisors
  that may include, but are not limited to, currently licensed or otherwise regulated
  occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants, psychologists, physician
  assistants, teachers, social workers, nurses, and physical therapists.
- The Facility will provide a minimum of one fieldwork educator for every 10 students participating in fieldwork Level I.
- 4. Each supervisor shall receive a copy of the Guidelines for Supervision, Roles, and Responsibilities by the American Occupational Therapy Association, hereinafter the Guidelines, to enhance supervision and supervisors shall be instructed to refer to the Guidelines for proper supervision of students.
- 5. To further insure that it provides protection of consumers and opportunities for appropriate role modeling of occupational practice supervision should be direct and gradually decrease to less direct supervision as appropriate for the setting, severity of the client's condition, and the ability of the student. Supervisors shall refer to the Guidelines to ensure proper implementation of this provision.
- 6. The Facility reserves the right to remove any student or faculty member who

endangers patient health, welfare, or safety or disrupts the operations of the Facility.

The Facility shall make reasonable efforts to notify the College in advance of such removal. In addition, the Facility shall have the right to remove a student whose health status is a detriment to the students' successful completion of his or her assignment in the Clinical Training Program.

 The facility shall maintain a copy of each student's medical records in a file separate and apart from the student's educational records.

# C. Responsibilities of the Students:

- All students shall be responsible for providing the necessary and appropriate uniforms
  required by, but not provided by the Facility and at no cost to the Facility.
- All students shall provide their own transportation and living arrangements.
- All students shall report to the Pacility on time.
- All students shall conform to the standards and practices established by the College while training in the Facility.
- All students shall obtain prior written approval of the Facility and the College before
  publishing any material relating to the Clinical Training Program directly or
  indirectly.
- 6. All students shall be responsible for complying with all pertinent rules and regulations, policies, and procedures established by the Facility, as they may be amended from time to time. The Facility agrees to share all rules and regulations, policies and procedures with the College and to obtain written acknowledgement from each student confirming review of such rules, regulations, and policies and procedures.

#### D. General Information:

The College shall provide each student with general instruction in the infection control
procedures used in the Facility's settings, including a review of the OSHA blood borne
pathogens regulations. The Facility agrees that, as part of each student's orientation to

- the Facility's rules, regulations, policies, and procedures, it shall instruct the student on its infection control procedures, including the OSHA Blood borne pathogens regulations, as they have been implemented by the Facility.
- It is agreed by both parties that at no time will they discriminate against any
  employee, applicant, patient, or students because of race, color, creed, sex, national
  origin, age, disability, marital status, sexual preference, or veteran status.
- 3. No student referred to the Pacility under this Agreement shall in any way be considered an employee or agent of the Pacility or the College, nor shall any student be entitled to any fringe benefits, worker's compensation, disability benefits, or other rights normally afforded to employees of the Pacility or the College. The parties shall be independent contractors with respect to each other.
- The College shall pay the County a quarterly clinical site fee in the amount of \$1,875.00, paid at the end of each quarter.

#### E. Term of Agreement:

The term of this Agreement shall be for the period commencing April 27, 2016 through April 26, 2017, with three (3), remaining twelve (12) - month renewal options. It is the sole discretion of the Facility (Bergen County) to exercise an option. At any time during this agreement, either party may give thirty (30) days prior written notice of its intention to terminate the Agreement to the other party in accordance with the notice provision set forth in Section F. of this Agreement. However, less notice will be required if it is determined by the Facility that continuation of the Agreement will be detrimental to quality patient care.

#### F. Miscellaneous:

- Neither this Agreement nor any obligation or right hereunder may be assigned to any
  third party without the prior written consent of the other party. Any purported
  assignment without such consent shall be null and void.
- All notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and be deemed to have been properly given if delivered by personal delivery or by certified

or registered mail, return receipt requested to the parties at the addresses listed below or to such other address as the parties shall designate by written notice to the party hereunder.

- 3. This agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws and in the courts of the State of New Jersey and its venue shall be any court of appropriate jurisdiction located in New Jersey.
- 4. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all private agreements, written or oral. No modification of or amendment to the Agreement shall be effective or binding on either party unless in writing and signed by both parties. The parties also agree and acknowledge, as this is a negotiated agreement, the rule of construction that any ambiguities be construed against the drafting parties shall not apply. The section beadings as to the contents of particular sections are inserted only for convenience and are not construed as part of the Agreement
- 5. Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended to create any third party beneficiary rights nor shall an employment relationship be construed as a result of this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Facility has the resources to provide clinical training to students in basic occupational therapy procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Facility and the College desire to affiliate for the purpose of providing a clinical training program (hereinafter the "Clinical Training Program") at the Facility for students in the College's Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

# A. Responsibilities of the College:

- Assume and maintain full responsibility for the planning and execution of the
  educational program in occupational therapy, including programming,
  administration, curriculum content, faculty appointments, faculty
  administration, and the requirements for promotion and graduation of students.
- The College shall designate a faculty member who shall serve as the "Academic Fieldwork Coordinator," to coordinate the Clinical Training Program with the Facility. Both parties shall mutually agree upon the Clinical Training Program.
- 3. The College shall coordinate with the Facility to establish a schedule of

- student assignments, and the number of students eligible to participate in the Clinical Training Program. Both parties shall agree on the dates, hours, and duration of the assignment.
- The Academic Fieldwork Coordinator shall assign to the Facility only those students who have satisfactorily completed the prerequisite didactic portion of the curriculum.
- 5. The College shall coordinate with the Facility the performance of an annual joint evaluation to determine if the participation of the occupational therapy students meets the standards of patient care of the Facility, as well as the educational objectives of the College.
- 6. The College and its students are responsible for complying with all pertinent rules and regulations, policies and procedures established by the Facility, as they may be amended from time to time.
- 7. The College and its students are required to maintain patient confidentiality as required by all federal, state and other applicable laws and regulations, including but not limited to: the Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records, 42 C.F.R. Section 2; the New Jersey AIDS Reporting and Confidentiality Law, N.J.S.A. 26-SC-5 et seq.; New Jersey Public Health Law; and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and the HIPAA Privacy Standards.
- 8. The College and its students are required to maintain such records as may be required by the Facility to comply with federal and state law and regulations, and with required third-party payers and regulatory authorities, including, but not limited to Medicare, Medicaid, the Comptroller General of the United States and the Department of Health and Human Services. The responsibilities to prepare and maintain such records and reports will survive termination of

the Facility and must be maintained and retained on the Facility's premises.

The College and its students shall also be required to maintain and retain all records and reports partinent to the students' clinical experience. These records shall be made available to the Facility upon request.

- The College on behalf of each assigned student shall provide the Facility with the following:
  - A. Evidence determined by a physical examination that each student is in good general health and free from a health impairment that is of potential risk to a patient or which might interfere with the performance of his or her duties. The evidence also includes passing a drug test, and being free from any other condition that would interfere with the student's ability to satisfy the requirements of this Agreement and/or potentially create risks to his or her own health, and the health and safety of the Facility, its patients, staff, visitors, and other
  - B. Evidence that each student has received: (1) vaccination for rubella consistent with good medical practice, or a rubella screening blood test with documentation of its results, including scrologic evidence of immunity (all scronegative female students of child-bearing age shall provide documentation that they were informed regarding the potential adverse effects of rubella during pregnancy); (2) vaccination for measles (rubeola) or evidence of immunity to measles for those students born in 1957 or later, and (3) PPD (Mantoux) skin test for traberculosis prior to participation in the Clinical Training Program and no less than every year thereafter for students with negative chest x-rays. All students who are scronegative and unvaccinated shall be clinically restricted in the event of a rubella or rubeola outbreak in the Facility.
- C. The Academic Fieldwork Coordinator shall maintain a current list of all students who are scronegative and unvaccinated and provide such list to the Facility upon request.
- D. Prior to commencement of any assignment in the Clinical Training Program, the Facility shall receive evidence that the student has received the vaccination against hepatitis B, proof of immunity to hepatitis B, or a signed declination form indicating that the student has declined to be vaccinated against hepatitis B
- E. Criminal Background checks are completed by the College and can be supplied to the clinical site as requested.
- 10. The College shall obtain and maintain at its own expense during the term of this Agreement, and any renewal hereof, a comprehensive liability policy

including general and professional liability. The policy must insure the College against any and all claims for personal and bodily injury or death and property damage resulting from the performance of services by the College, its employees, staff and agents, and all students participating in the Clinical Training Program and/or the presence of students or other College personnel on the Facility's premises. Such insurance shall be in the amount of no less than \$1,000,000 per incident and an annual aggregate of \$3,000,000. Such insurance is to be written by a carrier licensed in New Jersey and rated at least an "A" by A.M. Best Company. The College is also responsible for any deductible or retention under these policies. The College, upon execution of this Agreement and anytime upon request, shall furnish the Facility with evidence that it has complied with the above requirements for liability coverage. The Facility shall be listed as an additional insured on all liability insurance policies of the College.

11. The College agrees to indemnify and to hold harmless the Facility, its officers, directors, trustees, agents, employees, assignees, affiliates, representatives, joint-ventures, successor corporation(s) and health care personnel, directly or indirectly involved in any way in the Clinical Training Program from any and all liabilities, claims, actions, suits, settlements, judgments, costs, damages and liabilities including medical claims or expenses and attorney's fees, resulting from, arising out of or which might arise or otherwise be asserted or connected with the operation or conduct of the Clinical Training Program including, but not limited to negligence involving the death or injury of a patient. The College also agrees to indemnify and hold the Facility harmless for its failure to comply with any of the obligations or representations in the Agreement, including but not limited to a failure to maintain insurance as required in the

# B. Responsibilities of the Facility

- 1. The Facility will provide orientation for the faculty and students.
- For Level I fieldwork experiences, The Facility shall provide qualified supervisors
  that may include, but are not limited to, currently licensed or otherwise regulated
  occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants, psychologists, physician
  assistants, teachers, social workers, muses, and physical therapists.
- The Facility will provide a minimum of one fieldwork educator for every 10 students
  participating in fieldwork Level I.
- 4. Each supervisor shall receive a copy of the Guidelines for Supervision, Roles, and Responsibilities by the American Occupational Therapy Association, hereinafter the Guidelines, to enhance supervision and supervisors shall be instructed to refer to the Guidelines for proper supervision of students.
- 5. To further insure that it provides protection of consumers and opportunities for appropriate role modeling of occupational practice supervision should be direct and gradually decrease to less direct supervision as appropriate for the setting, severity of the client's condition, and the ability of the student. Supervisors shall refer to the Guidelines to ensure proper implementation of this provision.
- 6. The Facility reserves the right to remove any student or faculty member who endangers patient health, welfare, or safety or disrupts the operations of the Facility. The Facility shall make reasonable efforts to notify the College in advance of such removal. In addition, the Facility shall have the right to remove a student whose health status is a detriment to the students' successful completion of his or her assignment in the Clinical Training Program.
- The facility shall maintain a copy of each student's medical records in a file separate and apart from the student's educational records.

# C. Responsibilities of the Students:

- All students shall be responsible for providing the necessary and appropriate uniforms
  required by, but not provided by the Facility and at no cost to the Facility.
- 2. All students shall provide their own transportation and living arrangements.
- All students shall report to the Facility on time.
- All students shall conform to the standards and practices established by the College
  while training in the Facility.
- All students shall obtain prior written approval of the Facility and the College before
  publishing any material relating to the Clinical Training Program directly or
  indirectly.
- 6. All students shall be responsible for complying with all pertinent rules and regulations, policies, and procedures established by the Facility, as they may be amended from time to time. The Facility agrees to share all rules and regulations, policies and procedures with the College and to obtain written acknowledgement from each student confirming review of such rules, regulations, and policies and procedures.

#### D. General Information;

- 1. The College shall provide each student with general instruction in the infection control procedures used in the Facility's settings, including a review of the OSHA blood borne pathogens regulations. The Facility agrees that, as part of each student's orientation to the Facility's rules, regulations, policies, and procedures, it shall instruct the student on its infection control procedures, including the OSHA Blood borne pathogens regulations, as they have been implemented by the Facility.
- It is agreed by both parties that at no time will they discriminate against any
  employee, applicant, patient, or students because of race, color, creed, sex, national

- 3. No student referred to the Facility under this Agreement shall in any way be considered an employee or agent of the Facility or the College, nor shall any student be entitled to any fringe benefits, worker's compensation, disability benefits, or other rights normally afforded to employees of the Facility or the College. The parties shall be independent contractors with respect to each other.
- 4. Eastwick College shall pay a clinical site fee quarterly in the amount of \$1,875.00 for taking our Occupational Therapy Assistant students at various locations/sites paid at the end of each quarter.

## E. Term of Agreement:

The term of this Agreement shall be for the period April 27, 2015 to April 26, 2016 with four (4) twelve (12) month renewal options. It is the sole discretion of the Facility (Bergen County) to exercise an option. At any time during this agreement, either party may give thirty (30) days prior written notice of its intention to terminate the Agreement to the other party in accordance with the notice provision set forth in Section F. of this Agreement. However, less notice will be required if it is determined by the Facility that continuation of the Agreement will be detrimental to quality patient care.

### F. Miscellaneous:

- Neither this Agreement nor any obligation or right hereunder may be assigned to any third party without the prior written consent of the other party. Any purported assignment without such consent shall be null and void.
- 2. All notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and be deemed to have been properly given if delivered by personal delivery or by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested to the parties at the addresses listed below or to such other address as the parties shall designate by written notice to the party hereunder

The section beadings as to the contents of particular sections are inserted only for convenience and are not construed as part of the Agreement
- 5. Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended to create any third party beneficiary rights nor shall an employment relationship be construed as a result of this Agreement.
